## APA National Prosecutorial AI and Data Summit

Putting Policy into Practice

Washington, DC

June 11-12, 2026

The Association of Prosecuting Attorneys (APA), in partnership with Microsoft and the Arlington Commonwealth's Attorney's Office, presents the 2026 National Prosecutorial AI and Data Summit. This year's Summit will feature panel discussions and presentations focused on the practical implementation of artificial intelligence and data analytics in prosecutors' offices. With the theme *Putting Policy into Practice*, sessions will explore how offices are operationalizing data to inform strategies in daily workflows, courtroom practice, diversion programs, and public-facing transparency efforts.

Prosecutors, data analysts, and researchers will examine real-world applications of AI and data, including building data partnerships, developing office-wide AI policies and governance structures, using data to support prosecutor-led diversion programs, integrating data across disciplines, and lessons learned from deploying AI and other data-driven technology tools. Attendees will have the opportunity to engage with experienced practitioners and national experts, participate in practical discussions, and strengthen peer networks. Join colleagues from across the country to exchange lessons learned and gain actionable insights to responsibly leverage AI and data in support of fair, effective prosecutorial practice.

This session focuses on helping prosecutors' offices move from general understanding of AI to practical, responsible implementation. Participants will learn how to assess their office's readiness by evaluating current workflows, data quality, staffing capacity, and legal obligations. The session also covers how to select and vet AI vendors, with an emphasis on transparency, security, accuracy, and accountability. Attendees will explore the benefits and risks of starting with pilot programs versus full-scale deployment, and how to measure success at each stage. Finally, the session emphasizes the importance of training staff and establishing clear internal policies to ensure AI tools are used ethically, consistently, and in compliance with due process.

**11:30am-12:45 pm Innovative Use of Data and AI to Improve the Workplace**

This training session brings prosecutors and data analysts together to explore innovative, real-world uses of data and AI to strengthen prosecutorial decision-making and office efficiency. Participants will examine how data and AI can be used to identify patterns, prioritize cases, improve efficiency, and measure effectiveness across an office. The session explores how offices can responsibly scale AI use while maintaining fairness, transparency, and prosecutorial discretion.

## **BREAKOUT SESSIONS**

**1:30 pm-2:30 pm AI and the Courtroom**

This session examines the evolving role of artificial intelligence in courtroom proceedings and its impact on prosecutorial practice. Prosecutors will explore how AI-powered tools—from evidence analysis platforms to predictive analytics—are transforming case preparation, trial strategy, and decision-making. This session is designed to equip prosecutors with actionable insights for leveraging AI technology to enhance courtroom effectiveness, improve outcomes, and advance the principles of justice.

### **How to Develop Data Partnerships and Create Data Stories**

This session provides an in-depth look at how strong collaborations between prosecutor offices and research partners can drive meaningful improvements in prosecutorial practice. Participants will learn how research partners can introduce objective metrics and transparent reporting frameworks and offer real life examples on creating data stories for transparency and community engagement. This session is a 101 on identifying potential research partners and creating a data story that aligns with office goals and accountability.

### **Using Data and AI to Support Prosecutor Led Programming**

This session examines how data can be used to design, implement, and evaluate prosecutor-led programming, including diversion programs. Participants will explore how data helps identify appropriate candidates for diversion, assess risk and needs, and ensure programs are applied fairly and consistently. The session also addresses how outcome data can be used to measure effectiveness, improve program design, and demonstrate impact to stakeholders and the public. Emphasis is placed on balancing data-driven decision-making with prosecutorial discretion, transparency, and effectiveness.
